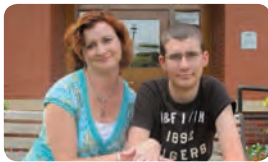

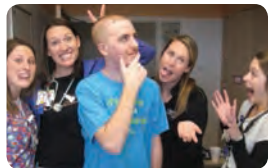

Following World War II, it was apparent there would be a post-war baby-boom and that Saint Louis would require additional medical facilities for treating children. A group of studies by a nationally known hospital consulting firm revealed an urgent need for additional pediatric facilities and for the training of specialists in child abuse.

The first steps toward construction of a Catholic sponsored pediatric hospital in the area began when Joseph Cardinal Ritter appointed a Board of Governors to head an effort to raise funds for the building of the hospital. The Board launched a campaign to gather funds – not solely from large corporate donations, but also through contributions from individuals. Over 100,000 Saint Louisans, many of them school children, responded with donations that totaled nearly \$6 million.
