Lochland's challenging layout ranges in length from 5,800 to nearly 7,000 yards. It offers bent grass greens and a mixture of rye/bluegrass fairways. You'll be able to test your skills against Lochland's signature hole, the **563-yard par 5**, #18. All male golfers will hit over the lake from the tee and then again on their second shot. **John Daly**, in conjunction with the 1992 Nebraska Boy's State High School Championship, played an exhibition and drove over the lake requiring an approximate carry of 310 yards.

You'll find the golf course under the guidance of course superintendent **Craig Ferguson**, to be in immaculate condition. The course is often cited as the best-conditioned golf course in the state of Nebraska. Lochland was recognized in 1999 as the "inaugural" winner as the "**Golf Facility of the Year**" by the Nebraska Section, PGA of America.

In addition to Lochland, Hastings offers many exciting options for entertainment including: Champions Sports and Recreation, YMCA and the Lied Super Screen Theatre. Hastings is also the home of legendary Nebraska football coach turned Congressman, **Dr. Tom Osborne**. It is a condition of the competition at this event that shoes with Traditionally-designed spikes (regardless of composition i.e. ceramic, plastic, etc.) or spikes, regardless of design, comprised either entirely or partially of metal (when such metal will come in contact with the surface of the putting green) are prohibited.

Penalty for breach of this condition: DISQUALIFICATION.

#### <u>Important Facts and Contestant Information</u>

#### **Mandatory Registration**

Competitors must register on Sunday, June 13<sup>th</sup> between the hours of 11 & 4:00p.m. Registration will be located in the clubhouse. You will not be called to the tee. It is the competitor's responsibility to be on the tee at your specified time.

#### Format

54-hole Stroke Play competition. The Rules Committee may reduce the competition to fewer holes due to weather constraints, provided all players in the age division have completed the same holes.

#### **Practice Rounds**

There will be a 1:30 pm Shotgun on Sunday for practice rounds. The contestant practice round fee is \$30.00. The fee for Parent / Guardians is \$85.00. Call The Lochland Golf Shop at **(402) 462-8783** to reserve hole assignments. Practice Rounds are also available Saturday after 3:00pm. Please let the golf shop know you are with the PGA Junior Series.

#### Caddies

Caddies are NOT permitted. You must carry your own bag during competition.

#### Golf Cars

Players are not permitted to ride in golf cars during competition except where golf car shuttles are designated by the PGA Rules Committee.

#### Practice Range

There is no charge for practice balls on tournament days. The range will open at 6:30am and close at 6:00pm.

#### Pace of Play

The Rules of Golf require that a player shall at all times play without undue delay. PGA Officials will use discretion concerning the Pace of Play of early groups. All groups will be expected to play at a reasonably fast pace, 14 minutes per hole. Any group falling a hole (par 4 or par 5) behind and is over the 14 minute-per-hole pace is subject to being timed. A group will be warned when they are out of position and about to be timed.

#### **Timing**

The timing of a player's stroke will begin when a player has reached his or her ball and it is clearly his or her turn to play. A player will be allowed 40 seconds to complete his or her stroke.

*Exception:* An additional 10 seconds will be allowed for the player who is first to play on or near the putting green and the first to play on par 3 holes. If a player exceeds the time limit on one occasion, he or she will be given a warning.

*Penalty:* If a player exceeds the time limit on a second occasion, he or she will receive a One stroke penalty; for a Third offense-Two stroke penalty; and for a subsequent offense-Disqualification.

#### Withdraw/Alternate

Please call 561-624-8528 if you must withdraw before the competition so we may contact the next alternate to participate.

#### Scoring Area

At the conclusion of your round, please go to the scoring tent behind #18 green to check scores and return your scorecard. You are only responsible for the correct hole-by-hole scores and two signatures (i.e., your markers and your own).

#### Suspension of Play

A suspension for a dangerous situation (i.e.: lightning or tornado) shall be signaled by one long siren or horn blast. Players shall discontinue play immediately and seek shelter. All other types of suspensions shall be signaled by three short blasts. All practice areas shall be closed during suspension for a dangerous situation until the committee has declared them open for use.

#### Play-Offs

All ties for first place only will be decided by a sudden death play-off on a hole to be determined by the Committee. All other ties will be decided by a scorecard play-off, the winner being determined on the basis of the total score of the last nine (holes 10-18). If the players have the same score for the last nine holes, the winner will be determined on the basis of the last six (13-18), last three (16-18), and finally last hole (18th).

#### **Award Plaques**

Plaques will be awarded to the top three places in each age division. The presentation of these prizes will take place by the scoreboard immediately following conclusion of play for each age group.

#### **Westfield Junior PGA Championship**

Each Boys' and Girls' 13-15 age division winner from the first four (6) PGA Junior Series events earn berths in The PGA of America's premiere Junior showcase event – The Westfield Junior PGA Championship, July 14-17, at Westfield Center, Ohio.

#### **Junior World Championship Exemptions**

Each Boys' and Girls' 16-17 age division winner from the first four (6) PGA Junior Series Events qualify to compete in the Junior World Championship, July 13-16, in San Diego, Calif.

#### Personal Appearance and Conduct

Players must be neat in appearance with respect to personal grooming and clothing. Players may not wear denim shorts. Boys are to wear collared or designer-collared shirts. Hats must be worn

forwards and shirts tucked in. Any conduct unbecoming a junior golfer shall be subject to one warning by an official then immediate disqualification at any time thereafter. Such conduct shall include, but is not limited to; abusive language, club throwing, profanity, showing disrespect to volunteers or officials, littering or leaving trash on the course, or abuse of the golf course facility. Players must be willing to comply with club rules with respect to dress code and spike policy.

#### **Parents**

We appreciate spectator support of our event. Please walk at least 50 yards behind or to the side of play. Please walk in the rough and remain clear of fairways. It would be a good idea to wear comfortable shoes due to the long walk. Under no condition are you allowed to offer any advice to a contestant during the round. Please be mindful of the high level of concentration needed by the participants to achieve their best. It is OK to help look for balls or carry umbrellas. Please do not interfere or distract players with the use of cameras, cell phones or beepers.

#### **Spectator Carts**

Spectators who request relief under the Americans with Disabilities Act and seek a reasonable accommodation for their disability by the use of a motorized golf car during the event competition shall be required to submit a request in writing with state authorized handicap number to the PGA Tournament Department one week prior to the tournament date for review and determination.

#### Breakfast / Lunch

Meals are not provided. The Food & Beverage facility will be open to Competitors and Parents / Guardians. Cash and Credit Cards are accepted.

#### Final Round

You will be re-grouped according to your first round score for starting times. For final round starting times service you may call **(402) 462-8783** between 7:00-8:00 p.m. on Tuesday. The times will be posted on all doors of the golf shop. **The only "Official" Times will be posted on the public scoreboard.** We will use the "reverse horseshoe" *(just like PGA and LPGA TOUR)* for Boys 16-17, which means low scores teeing off last off tee #1, with the middle of the pack teeing off early on both tees, and the higher scores last off tee #10.
